LOWCOUNTRY

The native animals that live in the woods, swamps, and waters of the South Carolina Lowcountry are being displaced by the rapidly growing population of our area. At the Lowcountry Zoo, you can see these animals in areas maintained as close as possible to their natural habitats.

GENERAL INFORMATION

DINING: Near the entrance of the sculpture garden, **Harvest** offers a full lunch menu with soups, salads, sandwiches, and desserts. **Harvest** and the outdoor patio area are WI-FI accessible. In the center of the garden, The Old Kitchen serves light refreshments, salads, and wraps. Open 10 a.m. – 4:00 p.m.

The Courtyard Cafe, located in the Wall Lowcounty Center, serves sandwiches, hot dogs, and light snacks.

PICNICS: We have two designated picnic areas, one diagonally across from the main parking lot and one near the zoo, where picnicking is allowed. At certain times, picnic tables may also be available outside the Leonard Pavilion.

SHOPPING: Browse through the many areas in **Keepsakes, the Brookgreen Museum Shop** and see works by local artists, artisans, and authors; also, toys for children and garden wares. Shipping is available.

ACCESSIBILITY: Brookgreen Gardens is wheelchair accessible.

JUST FOR KIDS: The Children's Storybook Forest and the Children's Sensory Trail are sure to delight. Located across from the Lowcountry Zoo, these areas are open all day.
